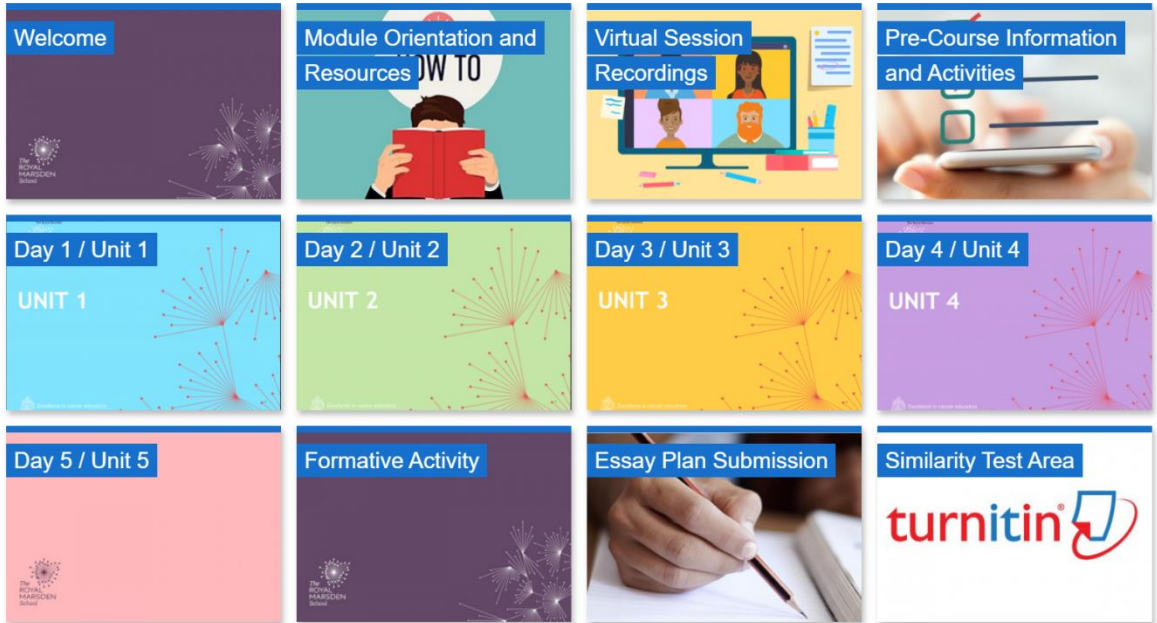


How to submit your assignment to the Similarity Test Area


